gree. He never turned a deaf ear to any charitable appeal, and a small action was foreign to his nature. The town of Kenilworth will ever stand as an enduring monument to his faith in the community, while none in years to come can view the remarkable growth without recalling the fact that Mr. Chiles, with comparatively little capital, staked all on the town, which he virtually founded.

The Commissioners of Kenilworth, at a call meeting yesterday afternoon, authorized the drafting of suitable resolutions of respect to the memory of the former mayor.

A committee from the Asheville Real Estate Board, composed of J. G. Stikeleather, chairman; D. L. Meriwether, E. E. Reed, A. S. Guerard and R. S. Brown, yesterday drafted the following resolution:

"Whereas: Almighty God, Omnipotent Ruler of the universe, has seen fit in his inscrutable wisdom, to remove from the walks of life our esteemed fellow realtor, and friend, Mr. J. M. Chiles, we, his brother realtors wish thus to give expression of our grief at his passing and our appreciation of his many virtues as exemplified in his daily life while numbered among the living.

"A noble spirit has passed into the great beyond leaving behind a memory that will ever be a lasting inspiration to us, his friends. Therefore be it:

"Resolved that we extend to his devoted wife and family our most sincere sympathy in this their dark hour of bereavment. May the God of Love watch over them and keep them."
