



Succeeds B. L. Trexler Whose Resignation Was Accepted

Claude Williams, formerly of Colorado Springs, Colo., yesterday was appointed policeman of the Town of Kenilworth succeeding Chief of Police B. Lawrence Trexler, whose resignation Thurs was accepted by the town-bod. Williams, it was said, has had wide experience in law enforcement circles, having formerly served as a deputy sheriff in several Colorado countles, besides being connected with the traffic department.

E. G. Fleming, who has served as a patrolman in Kenilworth for several years, has been retained and will serve with the new officer. The policemen, it was announced, hereafter will serve directly under the direction of T. P. Johnson, commissioner of public safety of Kenilworth.

Mayor Caine said last night that appoximately \$30,000 has been expended by Kenilworth in its recent street widening program and that between \$10,000 and \$12,000 has been paid out in its new sewer and water system. Another addition included the widening by seven feet of the new entrance from the Biltmore avenue approach.
